I cannot believe that we have reached the end of Term 1. The term has raced by and been very busy. OLNA testing was conducted during March for identified Year 10, 11 and 12 students. Students who do not reach a Band 8 in Year 9 NAPLAN are required to sit the OLNA testing. OLNA is conducted in March and September and students have 6 opportunities from Year 10 to meet the required standard of a Category 3 in OLNA. This is an important process as reaching a Category 3 in Reading, Writing and Numeracy is a WACE requirement. The Year 11's have commenced their studies towards WACE and/or ATAR and are working steadily to maintain their progress. Students who have not performed well in their first round of assessments have been individually interviewed and strategies to support progress have been identified and put into place. It is important that Year 11 students maintain steady progress during the year as this can lessen the pressure in Year 12. Year 12 students have now completed a third of their academic year and their focus should be maintaining good study habits and working consistently towards their goals. Their academic progress is being closely monitored and interviews with students of concern have been conducted to support them in maintaining their progress towards WACE and/or ATAR. I would like to thank Mrs Sexton and Mrs Johnson for continuing to monitor their respective groups of students in both their academic and personal well-being.

The school ball was the highlight of the term for me. All the students looked absolutely wonderful and thoroughly enjoyed the evening. This was my first Narrogin SHS ball and it was truly a spectacle. I loved the student arrivals and red carpet. The hall was decorated beautifully and the evening ran like clockwork. My thanks goes to Mrs Castle, Mrs Johnson, the prefects, ball committee, Year 10 waiters and waitresses and the parents who gave up their time before, during and after the ball and who made the evening truly enjoyable.

This term the 4S program has been run on a Tuesday between 10.00am and 11.00am. This session has been planned by Mrs Sexton and Mrs Johnson to assist Year 11 and 12 students with study skills, study planning, University talks, TISC and TAFE applications, preparing for life after Year 12 and much more.

Relevant guest speakers have been invited throughout the year to address pertinent matters with students. The 4S program reduces the amount of time students are taken out of class and students access the information through Connect. This will continue throughout the year.

Looking ahead to Term 2, the Year 12 General students will be completing the Externally Set Tasks provided by SCSA (School Curriculum and Standards Authority). These tasks are scheduled from 7 May to 24 May and are conducted during normal class time. The results from these tasks are a part of the students' assessment and are used as a moderation exercise by SCSA. General Year 12 students will receive the schedule of testing by the end of Term 1. ATAR exams will be run from 27 June to 31 June. The term will conclude with Country Week with teams being selected and training commencing.

I wish all students and their families a Happy Easter and I hope the break is one where the students can recharge in preparation for a busy term ahead.

NAPLAN is delivered online for our students as of May this year. The assessment will be delivered to Year 7 & 9 students from Tuesday 14 May until Friday 24 May 2019. We will be providing students with the opportunity to practice the online component prior to Week 3 next term.

Bullying is a varying issue in schools, both private and public, which we continue to address. The Department of Education has released a statement for *Let's stand together: Addressing violence in Schools*. We have referred to this whilst developing our Whole School Positive Behaviour Plan. I will be placing the final draft of this plan in Connect for feedback at the beginning of Term 2. Students have provided feedback in term 4 2018 which has been incorporated. School council has also viewed parts of the plan and would appreciate parent feedback to assist in making sure we get this right.

We had a Bullying No Way Breakfast on 15 March. Staff served breakfast for all students before school. Students then wrote on orange chain links of their messages to combat bullying and then these were hung in the corridors.



Harmony Day was also a day acknowledged during our Merit Assembly. Orange ribbons were provided for everyone to wear.



The Senior School Ball was inclusive in making sure everyone had a great time and were included in all the activities throughout the night.

I had the great opportunity to attend the WISE Woman excursion with selected female students at Murdoch University. This was to encourage girls to engage in the Science and Maths career pathways. The students

encouraged the girls to consider these options as a career pathway.





It is hard to believe April holidays are already upon us.

Grammar Workbook for English

All students in years 7-10 were asked to purchase a Grammar Workbook for English this year and to date we still have many students who still don't have the book.

There are a number of reasons this book was chosen:

- The concepts covered are what are tested in NAPLAN and OLNA
- It is a structured, sequential grammar programme
- The book fits in students' files
- There is a revision test every four weeks

It is very economically priced at \$13.00.

Why students should have the book:

This grammar programme is worth 5% of the course in each semester.

There will be a test in Semester 1 and Semester 2 to assess students' progress that counts towards students' results.

It is programmed into English courses either weekly or fortnightly, depending on the class.

By law we cannot photocopy more than 10% of the book and that limit has now been reached.

I have ordered copies of the book for each year group. If students take \$13.00 to Administration and get a receipt and bring the receipt to the English Department we will give them the book.

Please find below the book required for each year / course:

English Works (red): Year Seven

English Rules 1 (green): Year Eight AND Year Nine Focus

English Rules 2 (orange): Year Nine AND Year Ten Focus

English Rules 3 (blue): Year Ten General

Sandakan Tour

The Borneo Exhibition Group Inc with Narrogin Sub-Branch of the RSL invites students from Year 9 to 11 to enter the PASS Anzac Awards Tour to Borneo April 2020.

It is an untold story of the 2500 Allied POWs who were sent to Sandakan, British North Borneo (now Sabah, East Malaysia) to build an airfield and supporting roads and services. The treatment of the POWs evolved from being harsh, to being brutal and inhumane, and finally death at the hands of their captors.

About half the number of POWs died in the Camp as a result of ill-treatment by starvation and brutality, so in 1945, knowing that they were losing the war the Japanese decided to march about 1100 emaciated men, down to about 7-8 stone in weight, who were still alive, inland to the mountain town of Ranau, a distance of 260 miles. These marches that commenced in late January and June, 1945 are now commonly known as the Sandakan Death Marches, as only six Australian POW's survived. They escaped and were rescued by local Kadazan men who hid them, cared for them then delivered them safely to Allied forces.

Selection for interested students will be conducted in September 2019 including an oral interview before a selected panel. All applicants are to indicate their knowledge through a specific criteria to present written assignments relating to the lead up from the Allied Surrender to the Japanese in Singapore on 15 February 1942, the internment of Allied POWs in Changi Prison, Singapore to their transportation to North Borneo, Capital City of Sandakan, to all related incidents to the POWs, Local Underground Movement, the Death Marches in 1945, and all those sent to Sarawak, to the Batu Lintang POW Camp in Kuching, and the Judicial Hearings against prisoners.
