Term 2 has passed by in a flash. It has been great to have the students return to school, and a sense of normality returning to our teaching and learning programs. Year 11 and 12 ATAR students have completed their Semester 1 exams. The Mathematics and Science Learning Areas chose not to set exams this semester and, instead, focused on completing their course work accompanied by in class assessments. All ATAR students wrote the English exam and this provided them with an opportunity to prepare for, and write an exam. All Year 12 students have now also completed their Externally Set Tasks for all general courses. I have been impressed by the way in which students have approached these tests and exams. It has been an unsettling time, however, the students have been focused and diligent in their preparation.

Academic monitoring of Year 11 and 12 students has been undertaken across the term. Students have been given their WACE trackers so that they can track their progress towards WACE achievement. One on one meetings have been held with students at risk and plans have been put in place to support them in meeting the requirements for WACE. This will continue into next term.

Year 10 students are in the process of selecting their subjects for Year 11, 2021. Mrs Sexton, Mrs Johnson and myself have been meeting with parents and students to assist with this process and support the students in making their pathway and subject choices. I would like to take this opportunity to thank both Mrs Sexton and Mrs Johnson with their help in this process. They both have a wealth of knowledge in this area and have dedicated a great deal of time to ensure that students are confident with their choices for 2021. This year we held a Subject Expo in the library so that students could hear firsthand from specialist teachers what the various subjects entail in Year 11 and 12. They also had the opportunity to view course and assessment outlines and speak to the teachers. This was a very successful afternoon with students reporting that this helped them in understanding the courses available.

I wish all students a good midyear break and look forward to seeing them back in Term 3.

I believe the term has just passed us by extremely fast and already preparing for not just Term 3, also 2021.

COVID – 19 continues to effect many aspects of the school. Semester reports for Year 7 – 10 will not include a grade. Attributes, Behaviour and Effort will continue to be assessed however grades will be omitted and staff will comment on the student engagement in the course. Student Reports will be disseminated in Week 10. These will be sent via Connect.

With the reports there is a Parent Teacher Interview evening scheduled on Thursday 23 July – first week of the Term 3. These interviews will provide further information on how students can achieve their best for each subject. The interviews will commence 3.30pm and the evening will close at 7.00pm. Parents will be able to book appointments through SOBS (School Online Booking Service) from Tuesday 30 June until 4.00pm Wednesday 22 July. I advise everyone to get in as soon as you can as we all know that the appointments get booked up quickly. Information will be texted and placed on Connect when the bookings are open on how to book an appointment. The evening will be held in the library and Trade Training Centre.

We will be embarking on our Transition program whereby we will be visiting our feeder schools in preparation for 2021. Now that parents are allowed on school sites we will be looking forward to meeting parents to our primary school visits. These will take place at the commencement of Term 3.

Our Years 7 – 9 students will also be embarking on their subject choices for 2021. There will be a number of new courses available for students so this has taken time for us to coordinate. We will also be having one lower school subject course selection booklet combining the years to assist parents in locating information in one place. These will be provided to students at the beginning of Term 3.

Ensure you enjoy the coming holidays and I look forward to catching up with parents and students in Term 3.

OLNA

Online Literacy and Numeracy (OLNA) testing will take place next term. Achieving a Category 3 in each of the Reading, Writing and Numeracy tests is a prerequisite for achieving a WACE. Students from Year 10 have two opportunities a year to sit the tests.

NAPLAN

Due to the cancellation of NAPLAN testing, Year 9 students will be offered the opportunity to participate in OLNA testing in August. All Year 9 students will complete the Reading and Numeracy tests and those students who did not reach a Band 8 for Writing in Year 7 NAPLAN will be required to sit the Writing test.

REPORTS

Reports will be available through Connect on the 3 July 2020 with Parent Teacher meetings held on the 22 July 2020. These reports provide important information about student progress and the teachers comments are important in highlighting where the students can improve. Year 10 students will not receive a grade, **however, the teachers' comments will give an indication of the students' engagement in each subject and their progress.**

Gastroenteritis

Gastroenteritis, or 'gastro' is a common condition in children of all ages. It occurs when the bowel is infected by a virus or bacteria. Symptoms include diarrhoea, vomiting, stomach cramps and sometimes, fever. Gastroenteritis, or 'gastro' is a common condition in children of all ages. It occurs when the bowel is infected by a virus or bacteria. Symptoms include diarrhoea, vomiting, stomach cramps and sometimes, fever.

Most cases in children are not serious, but it is very important to make sure that a child with gastro receives enough fluid.

If your child has gastro, keep them away from school for 48 hours after vomiting and diarrhoea have stopped. If symptoms persist see your family doctor.

The easiest way to prevent gastro is to make sure everyone in the family washes their hands regularly, especially before eating and after going to the toilet.
