

## **Wise Women Murdoch Excursion**

On Wednesday the 7 June, 18 female students from Narrogin Senior Highschool headed to Murdoch University to be part of the annual Wise Women event. The event was organised to inspire young women to work towards a career in the STEM industry. Many schools from around the state were part of the event, including students from Busselton SHS, Bunbury Cathedral Grammar School, Mount Barker SHS, Geraldton Grammar, and the Australian Christian College.

The event started off with the girls receiving a Murdoch University goodie bag on entry into the lecture theatre, and an explanation of the schedule for the day. This was followed by an address from guest speaker, Lilijana Nicholls. Lilijana explained how she had begun her journey into the STEM industry by first joining Murdoch University at the age of 15. She had achieved already completed a degree and was working towards a PHD at the age of 19. Lilijana discussed the hardships of falling apart with friends, her struggles with her social identity and her passion for science that pushed her forward. After a thank-you and a close, the girls headed out to morning tea (which had been highly anticipated).

The first practical workshop the girls were invited to was a haematology workshop, where the girls had to identify the differences between different blood smears using microscopes. They learnt how certain diseases affected blood cells, and why blood acted this way. This was followed by a microscopic observation of cells from major organs in the body, and the girls had to identify, using clues, which organ belonged to each slide. After this, the girls were able to look at the different shapes of bacteria. At the end of the session, the correct answers were identified on the organs challenge. The girls left for lunch, which had been provided by Murdoch.

The second workshop the girls attended was a fauna observation and rehabilitation workshop. The girls, in groups of three, sat in front of a caged "quenda" (a stuffed echidna toy). The lecturer explained how people observe animals using traps, including a wide variety of harmless devices used in different environments for different animals. The girls were tasked with "observing" the captured quenda, recording its physical status and if it had been captured before, which could be identified by the quenda's ear. The girls named their quendas, and then they were tasked with coming up with appropriate traps for an animal they were given.

Once the second workshop had closed, the girls were taken back to the lecture theatre along with the other schools, where a Q&A panel discussion was held. Four of the women involved in the workshop, including a careers advisor, answered questions from all the schools. They couldn't answer all the questions, as the event had to be closed at around 2:50 pm. The girls departed on the bus, driven by Mrs. Corner, and made their way back to Narrogin.


