The students were treated to a musical interlude when I played "From Little Things Big Things Grow" at the artwork titled "Land Rights", it was a humbling moment to be located in the heart of Australia's democratic and cultural life, acknowledging that we are moving forward together.










Our students had a wonderful educational tour of the national capital Canberra.

They were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage, and democracy. The Australian government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian government is contributing funding of \$1,530 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school on completion of the excursion. This allowed the students to attend at a minimal cost gaining an opportunity to participate in their first study tour.

# The Day We Flew Out


