Work Place Learning Information for Year 10 Students, Parents and Carers

Applications are now open for the WA public sector School-Based Traineeships (2027–2028) and will close at 5:00 pm on Wednesday, 5 August 2026.

These traineeships provide a valuable pathway for students entering Year 11 in 2027 who are considering an alternative senior school option. Participants gain practical workplace experience, develop industry skills, and complete a nationally recognised qualification while contributing toward their WA Certificate of Education.

Commencing in February 2027, the program runs for 18 months. Students work part-time (up to two days per week) in a WA public sector agency and receive a fortnightly wage.

The public sector includes government agencies that deliver essential services such as health, education, tourism, community support, sport and recreation, and environmental management. A traineeship offers the opportunity to build meaningful skills while contributing to the community.

Year 7 Students in “Have Sum Fun Live” Maths Competition

On Wednesday, 6 May 2026, nine of our Year 7 students from Mr Cowan’s 7MAT_1 and Ms Forsyth’s 7MAT_2 class represented the school in the Have Sum Fun Live online mathematics competition, coordinated by the Mathematical Association of Western Australia (MAWA).

The competition was live-streamed, bringing together schools from across the state for an engaging mathematical challenge. Students worked collaboratively in teams through four rounds of problem-solving, with each round consisting of eight questions to be completed within 20 minutes. Without the use of calculators or devices, participants relied on their mathematical thinking, teamwork, and communication skills to tackle a range of challenging problems.

The event provided our students with an opportunity to extend their problem-solving skills while experiencing the excitement of a real-time competition environment. They demonstrated teamwork, perseverance, and enthusiasm throughout the day.

We congratulate all nine students on their participation and commend them for representing Narrogin Senior High School with pride.

RISE Student Takes Cyber Security Passion to the Next Level

For Year 12 student **Annie Reid**, a growing passion for technology and cyber security is quickly becoming more than just an interest — it is shaping her future pathway.

As a valued member of the **RISE Program**, Annie has embraced opportunities to explore career pathways that align with her strengths, interests, and ambitions. Recently, she attended a **Cyber Boot Camp run by the Australian Federal Police (AFP)** during the school holidays, giving her a unique opportunity to build her knowledge and experience in the fast-growing world of cyber security.

Annie is currently completing a **Certificate III in Information Technology (ICT)** with a focus on cyber security, and the boot camp provided her with valuable hands-on exposure to the industry. The experience allowed her to work alongside professionals, develop practical skills, and gain insight into the important role cyber security plays in protecting individuals, organisations, and communities. Attending the boot camp has further strengthened Annie's enthusiasm for technology and confirmed her interest in pursuing cyber security as a future career pathway.

The RISE Program is designed to support students in developing meaningful pathways that connect education with real-world experiences. Annie's participation in the AFP Cyber Boot Camp is a great example of how students can engage in opportunities beyond the classroom to build confidence, skills, and direction for life after school.

"Attending the Boot Camp was both enjoyable and educational. I learned from industry professionals firsthand and made acquaintances with fellow peers who understood tech the same way I do.

*The day was jam-packed with many exercises and lessons; we learned directly from **Mark Blaszczyk** (The man who hacked **NASA** at 15) –and during an ice-breaker, I got to talk directly to Mark!–, we then had an exercise with the **Australian Federal Police** about tracking a cybercrime case, learned ethical hacking from a competitive gamified program created by the mentors there, and had conversations with ECU, TAFE and AFP mentors about their career paths and choices for our futures. I learned of pathways I can take and made some serious connections.*

My group won in the gamified program session, so I got to take home a prize of a nice hoodie! We finished with a panel that included all the mentors and parents (who were separated from us earlier that day—they were having an educational experience of their own). I stayed afterwards to continue talking with the mentors about future pathways, and they were extremely helpful. I'm just glad that they selected me to go. This experience has been useful to figure out my future place in the world."

Annie works alongside Mr Knight each day during Periods 3 and 4, building practical skills and real-world industry experience. When she attends the RISE classroom, she is dedicated to completing her Certificate III coursework and actively seeks opportunities to broaden her learning through additional ICT short courses to strengthen her portfolio and future pathway."

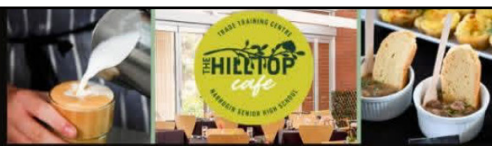

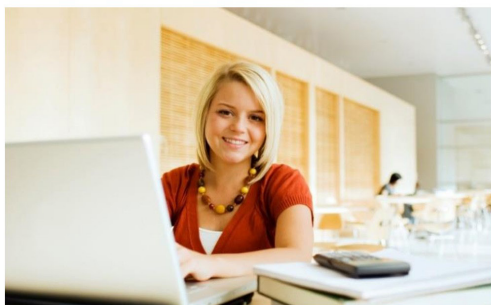
